2004 Man of the Year:

Salvatore Cassano, FDNY-Chief of Operations



Salvatore Cassano entered the New York City Fire Department in November 1969 and was assigned to Engine 31 and Engine 55 in Little Italy. Chief Cassano quickly rose through the ranks of the Department. In August 1977, he was promoted to Lieutenant and assigned to Ladder 113 in Brooklyn and remained at Ladder 113 upon his promotion to Captain in April 1984. In 1987, he was promoted to Battalion Chief and was assigned to Battalion 40. He was promoted again in 1993 to Deputy Chief and assigned to Division 14. While Salvatore Cassano was studying for promotion, he also attended Brooklyn Community College, John Jay College of Criminal Justice and graduated in June 1976 with a BS in Fire Science.

As Chief of Operations, he oversees day-to-day management of all FDNY units with primary concerns of fire suppression and the safety of members operating in the City of New York. On September 11, 2001 he assisted in the Incident Command, surviving both collapses. One of Chief Cassano's primary concerns is to assess and chart a new direction for the future, while still maintaining the traditional core values of service, bravery, safety, honor, dedication and preparedness. The Department's vision is one of partnership between uniformed and civilian members that will build on our core competencies to handle all fires, pre-hospital care and emergencies, as well as new challenges. He has been an instrumental part of rebuilding one of the greatest fire departments on Earth.

Married to Theresa, they have five children and reside in the borough of Staten Island. ♦

Our Special Recognition Award:

Nicola Arena, CEO Mediterranean Shipping Company



Nicola Arena was born in 1940 in Messina (Italy) and raised in Genoa where he graduated from the Merchant Marine Academy. He sailed as a licensed deck officer on board various ships of Italian Line and Texaco and was later appointed Senior Purser on board T/S Michelangelo, Raffaello and Leonardo Da Vinci. In 1968, he was made Junior Executive at Italian Line New York where he became Director of Marketing in 1972 and eventually Owner's Representative in 1974. In 1975, Mr. Arena started Italian Line new full container service between USA and Western Mediterranean. In 1978, he joined Containership Agency as Vice President. In 1987, he was named President of American Containership Agency. And, in 1989, Mr. Arena was named President and Chief Executive Officer of Containership Agency, which in 1994


changed its name to Mediterranean Shipping Company (USA) Inc., a steamship company specializing in ocean and intermodal transportation worldwide. MSC, with head offices in Geneva, is the 2nd largest container carrier in the world. The company operates 220 container ships with an aggregate capacity of 700,000 tons. MSC also owns four cruise ships (m/v Rhapsody, m/v Symphony, m/v Melody and the brand-new MSC Lirica) all based in Genoa. MSC (USA) employs over 650 people and has offices in Atlanta, Baltimore, Boston, Charleston, Charlotte, Chicago, Cleveland, Dallas, Detroit, Houston, Los Angeles, Miami, Norfolk, New Orleans, Oakland, Freeport, Nassau-Bahamas, and New York.

Our Humanitarian Award:

Francesca Tenconi, Founder, the Children's Skin Disease Foundation



Francesca Tenconi founded the Children's Skin Disease Foundation and has raised more than \$500,000 in donations and grants to support research, awareness, and several summer camps for children with skin disease.

Francesca was diagnosed with a rare and potentially fatal skin disease when she was 11. For over four years she battled her disease, receiving care from doctors at several respected hospitals on both the East and West coast. However, due to her disease and the treatments, she was unable to enjoy many of the experiences other children enjoyed. One thing she particularly missed was summer camp. Francesca thought this was unfair to her and to other children she met at hospitals and clinics, so she decided to start a camp that could be attended by doctors to care for the children. At the age of 16, Francesca established a foundation by asking family and friends to make a donation to form the Children's Skin Disease Foundation, in lieu of birthday gifts. She then solicited donations, organized several fundraisers, and obtained the use of a campsite in Northern California for "Camp Wonder". Next, she asked doctors and medical centers to recommend children with skin disease and contacted medical schools for volunteer doctors and nurses. She also recruited teen volunteers and adult counselors to supervise the children and participate in camp activities. By contacting medical supply companies, she secured a large quantity of medical supplies for use at camp - over \$8,000 in bandages is used each week of camp.



"Many of these children are born into a world of pain, disfigurement, and social rejection. At camp, no one stares, makes fun of scars, or refuses to go near a camper," she explains. "With a camp of their own, they are free to swim and participate in camp activities without embarrassment."

Since 2001, over 185 children have attended one of CSDF's camps. Many of the children have never slept away from home except in hospitals, and have never been swimming, worn shorts, or met other children with a skin disease. Burn victims also attend camp. Francesca is a sophomore at Duke University majoring in a tailored course of study focusing on the emotional and developmental problems faced by children with visible conditions such as skin disease and burns. She intends to pursue a medical degree and specialize in pediatric dermatology and psychology so she can continue helping children. She is also expanding the camps. Two additional camps will open this summer; one in Southern California and one in North Carolina. Francesca hopes to establish more camps including one in New

York, and to convince Congress to pass legislation to mandate insurance payment for bandages necessary for children with skin disease and burns. ♦
