

GET OUT AND VOTE:

In April 2006, for the first time since becoming a Republic in 1946, Italy allowed its 3.5 million citizens living abroad to vote in a national election by absentee ballots. Of the 3.5 million Italian citizens living abroad who were eligible to vote, 1.1 million actually did. North America's estimated 200,000 votes elected one Senator and two Deputies. In all 12 Deputies and 6 Senators will represent Italian expatriates. The main political issues for Expatriates, was improving RAI satellite TV reception, extending hours of local consulates and improving their performance, preserving Italian language and culture.





SPACE TRAVELERS

Charles Camarda has joined the ranks of Michael Massimino, Rocco Petrone, Rick Mastracchio, Albert Sacco and Lisa Caputo Novak as Italian Americans who have contributed to the U.S. exploration of space. A native of Queens, N.Y. Camarda served as a mission specialist on the space shuttle Discovery in 2005. An astronaut since 1996, he holds a M.S. and Ph.D. along with seven patents. He has earned over 21 NASA awards for technical innovations and accomplishments.
