FIREMEN'S MEMORIAL Riverside Park



The Firemen's Memorial (1913) in Riverside Park is one of the most impressive monuments in New York City. The monument was designed by H. Van Buren Magonigle (1867-1935), and its sculptures are attributed to Attilio Piccirilli (1866-1945).

This monument is said to have had its origins in the remarks of the Right Reverend Henry C. Potter at the funeral of Deputy Fire Chief Charles A. Kruger in 1908. Bishop Potter said that while there were many memorials to public and private citizens there were none "to our brave citizens who have lost or will sacrifice their lives in a war that never ends." Potter was the first chairman of the memorial committee, succeeded by Isidor Straus (1845-1912), a founder of Macy's department store, who lived at 105th Street and West End Avenue and died on the R.M.S. Titanic. The committee raised \$90,500, of which \$50,500 was through popular subscription and \$40,000 was in public funds allocated by the Board of Estimate and Apportionment on July 17, 1911.



Though originally intended for the north end of Union Square, the monument was ultimately built on the hillside facing the Hudson River at 100th Street. The memorial comprises a grand staircase (once flanked by ornamental luminaires), a balustraded plaza, a fountain basin, and the central monument. Made of Knoxville marble, the monument is a sarcophagus-like

structure with a massive bas-relief of horses drawing an engine to a fire (the original was replaced by a bronze replica in the 1950s); to the south and north are allegorical sculpture groups representing "Duty" and "Sacrifice," for which the celebrated model Audrey Munson (1891-1996) is said to have posed.

The architect, Magonigle, also designed the memorial to President William McKinley (1843-1901) in Canton, Ohio. Piccirilli, the sculptor, came from a family of master Italian stone carvers who settled in New York City and had a studio in the Bronx. They contributed sculptural and ornamental carving to the Washington Square Arch and the Pulitzer Fountain. Attilio Piccirilli also collaborated with Magonigle on the Maine Monument at Columbus Circle, at the southwest corner of Central Park.

The monument was dedicated on September 5, 1913, and was formally accepted on behalf of the city by Mayor William Gaynor (1848-1913), who died later that month. Each autumn, the incumbent mayor joins the fire commissioner and thousands of uniformed firefighters at the Firemen's Memorial to honor the memory of firefighters who have lost their lives in the line of duty. This well-attended ceremony reaffirms the dedication of these public servants, who perform heroic acts on a daily basis.

Born in New Jersey, Magonigle worked for Calvert Vaux and McKim Mead & White before opening his own practice in 1903. Magonigle and sculptor Attilio Piccirilli collaborated as architect and artist on two familiar monuments in New York City, on the Monument to the USS Maine in Columbus Circle, and on the Fireman's Memorial on Riverside Drive and West 100th Street.

Attilio Piccirilli (1866 - 1945) was born in Tuscany, Italy in 1866. He and his 5 brothers were trained as stone and marble carvers under the guidance of their father the carver Guisepppe Piccirilli. In 1888 the family immigrated to New York where they could further their art. Later Attilio and his brother Furio would move to a brownstone on 142nd Street in the Bronx section of New York and set up an studio next to their home that would eventually occupy an entire city block.

Over the years Attilio and Furio would be involved with the creation of some of the most important monumental sculpture of the time, including: The Four Continents by Daniel Chester French, and twelve allegorical statues on the cornice of the U.S. Custom House at Bowling Green; the N.Y. Stock Exchange Pediment by J.Q.A. Ward; the Senate Pediment of the U.S. Capital Building; tympana bas-reliefs at the Frick Mansion, (both sculpted by Attilio); thirty large allegorical figures for the cornice of the Brooklyn Muscum, the Indian Literature and Indian Law Giver by Attilio; the Civic Virtue Statue-Fountain by Frederick MacMonnies now at Queens Borough Hall; the Maine Monument, Central Park and Firemen's Monument, Riverside Park, both sculpted by Attilio, and The Joy of Life and Youth Leading Industry (cast in Pyrex Glass), Palazzo d'Italia, both at Rockefeller Center, by Attilio; and the carving of the pediments (2), attic sculptures (6), and Lions at The New York Public Library.
